Prayer is such a powerful way to speak from the heart to our beloved Lord. Prayer of petition for others for their goodwill or health, I'm sure, is on our lips many times during the day. I'd like you to be aware of a prayer warrior effort that the Grand Rapids DCCW is encouraging called <u>Seven Sisters Apostolate</u>. Basically, seven women commit to praying on a specific day of the week for one hour, ideally in Adoration or in front of the Blessed Sacrament, solely *for the needs of their priest or their bishop*. The women make this commitment for a year. Quite often it is from June to June, the month of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Every woman takes a different day of the week so their pastor is prayed for every day each day of the year. There are no meetings or reporting in. The organizer is called the anchoress. It is an apostolate of humility and prayer. Of course, the group can adjust prayer times to their needs and the number of women that are participating. If any of you are interested in this prayer effort beginning in your parish, please contact me.

Our SDCCW **Lenten Silent Retreat** was held on March 18 at the Center for Ministry. Fr. Andy LaFramboise was our leader and indicated that a retreat is a way of running <u>toward</u> Jesus. He explained the 4 E's of receiving the Eucharist: enchantment, encounter, event, & eat. Seventy-nine women attended despite the snowstorm! Our generous women donated \$220 to Emmaus House and \$140 to Vocations Purse.

The **East Region** held a Spring Meeting at St. Elizabeth Church/Holy Family Parish in Marlette on May 10. Forty-seven women enjoyed the day. As usual, the business meeting, praying the rosary, celebration of Mass, and lunch were part of the day's events. Beth Bauer from the Saginaw Diocese was the speaker for the day. Her topic was the Walking With Moms in Need project. Fr. Stephen Blaxton, pastor of Holy Family, celebrated Mass with us. In the afternoon, Verene Goulette, showed slides and explained about her assisting Ukrainian refugees. Officers were voted on: Rose Lilly, President; Ann Lukshaitis, VP; Vivian Janes, Secretary; Sephora Gillies, Treasurer.



The SDCCW has profited \$780 from the proceeds of the **rummage sale** that the Holy Family CCW/St. Elizabeth Church had in late July!
