### Christian Mothers & Women Holy Apostles Parish, Ruth

The purpose of our organization is to help each other bring up children in true Christian family life, assist the Pastor in maintaining the altars, provide the necessities of the sanctuaries according to the resources, and provide programs for the benefit of the parish.

Annual Easter and Christmas "Outreach program": includes sending cards to parishioners in nursing homes and delivering fruit baskets to the elderly and homebound; sew and quilt baby quilts for the newborns of the parish and cut and embroider baptismal gowns to be worn by the infants during Baptism; prepare the food and serve the families of our parishioners who have passed away after their funeral; weekly soup suppers are prepared and served during Lent; Giving Tree at Christmas; and serve refreshments for the parish graduating seniors after Mass.

Fundraisers include: annual parish "Mama Ruth Picnic" where items are donated including quilts, rag rugs, etc. for the raffle; various bake sales and craft shows; cutting, sewing and selling of rag rugs; and the sale of making homemade apple pies.
